YILTA BOOK TOUR

Over 10,000 Free Books by Indigenous Authors Given to Families in Navajo & Hopi Communities.

What is pink, has four wheels and contains millions of words? A massive pink truck filled with more than 10,000 Native books for people of all ages traveling across the Navajo and Hopi nations. On April 1, 2024, SBi Giving Foundation launched in a BIG WAY—making history with a first-of-its-kind book drop tour promoting Native authors and helping families in this region (considered a book desert) to build in-home libraries.

NDN Book Club partnered with the SBi Giving Foundation to distribute books, goodies and literary entertainment to areas across the Navajo and Hopi reservations — April 1-5.



The pink truck, nicknamed *Pinky the Rezmobile* by the NDN team, was emblazoned with a graphic designed by a Native artist of a Native girl reading under a rainbow on its sides with the words "Yiłta! Book Drop" meaning, "I read it!" Navajo Nation Vice President Richelle Montoya, Miss Navajo Nation Amy N. Reeves-Begaye and performer Radmilla Cody helped kickoff the Yiłta! tour at the Navajo Nation Library in Window Rock, April 1. The tour continued across the Navajo Nation to the Hopi Public Library in Kykotsmovi and Leupp Chapter House, April 2, Tuba City, April 3, Monument Valley, April 4, and finished up at the Diné College Library in Shiprock, New Mexico, April 5.

APACHE FISHING DERBY

Saturday, June 1, marked a wonderful celebration of community and nature at the annual White Mountain Apache Youth Fishing Derby. Held at the picturesque Bog Tank, located over 8,000 feet in elevation on the Fort Apache Reservation, the event unfolded under perfect weather conditions—sunny but pleasantly cool.

Bog Tank, nestled in Arizona's picturesque White Mountains, is renowned for its abundant trout population, including the Apache Trout, a species unique to this region. The lake became the bustling hub for hundreds of families, each armed with fishing poles, tackle, and bait, eager to snag the catch of the day.

The SBi Giving Foundation served free lunches to over 800 families and was thrilled to contribute to this cherished tradition by donating keepsake Apache Trout stickers, which brought smiles to the faces of children and adults alike. The derby saw participants of all ages casting their lines, with winners chosen across various age groups. Exciting prizes such as skateboards, bikes, and basketball hoops were awarded, adding to the thrill and competitive spirit of the day.





The SBi Giving Foundation proudly sponsored the 72nd Annual Miss Navajo Nation Pageant, a remarkable celebration of Navajo culture, leadership, and tradition. As part of our sponsorship, we were delighted to gift a Pendleton jacket to the newly crowned Miss Navajo, who will serve as a cultural ambassador and represent the Navajo Nation over the next 12 months. This tradition highlights the important role Miss Navajo plays in preserving and promoting Navajo values through leadership, guidance, and teaching.



BACKPACK GIVEAWAY

The back-to-school season usually brings excitement for children, marked by the anticipation of new school supplies, clothes, and the chance to reunite with friends. However, for many Native American families living on Tribal lands in the Southwest, this time of year can be overshadowed by anxiety and stress due to the financial burden of preparing for the new school year. Recognizing this challenge, the SBi Giving Foundation teamed up with the Cellular One Marketing Team to launch SBi's largest BackPack2School Tour ever. This initiative aimed to alleviate some of the financial stress on families by distributing 350 backpacks filled with essential school supplies to students in need.



Our goal was clear: to set students up for success by equipping them with the tools necessary for their schoolwork. The tour, which took place from July 9 through July 24, spanned six events across various communities, including Window Rock, Kayenta, Shiprock, Whiteriver, Hopi, and Zuni. Each event was a celebration, where Foundation and Cellular One team members brought an extra dose of joy by dressing up as beloved characters from Inside Out 2 and Toy Story. These fun-filled moments created lasting memories as children posed for photos with their new backpacks and favorite characters.



These sessions offered valuable insights into managing chronic conditions and adopting healthy habits, empowering elders to maintain and improve their well-being.

The Hózhó Elder Health Expo was more than just a day of education—it was a meaningful opportunity to celebrate and uplift the elders of our community. By sharing health tips and promoting a balanced lifestyle, the event aligned with the Navajo concept of Hózhó, which embodies balance, beauty, peace, and harmony. We are deeply grateful for the opportunity to serve our elders and to contribute to their health journey. The success of this inaugural event reinforces our commitment to continuing this important work and ensuring that our elders are supported, informed, and cared for in every way.

NEW YEAR'S EVE

KÉSHJÉÉ' TOURNAMENT

SBi Giving Foundation proudly sponsored the 15th Annual New Year's Eve Késhjéé'.



The Shoe Game, Késhjéé', is centuries old and is not just "a game." This sacred Navajo ceremony tells and shows the story of how the cycle of day and night came to be. Long ago, in ancient days, the night creatures and the day creatures did not understand the importance of the cycles of the universe. Each group wanted it to be either day or night all the time. A contest was held to see which group had the most power and this was the first Shoe Game.

The teams played through the night, trying to guess in which of four shoes the ball made of yucca root was hidden. As the game went on each team would gain or lose 102 yucca stems. Késhjéé', as a lattice of choices, represents life and the fact that the natural order of things cannot be changed. Not every choice can be correct, but lessons are learned, and experience is gained.
